INTRODUCTION

- Where to End: Finish the letter with a smooth, clean stroke at the black dot.

We've grouped the letters into special categories to make them easier to learn:

- 1. **Straight Line Letters**: These letters are made with easy, straight strokes.
- 2. Magic C Letters: These letters are built using a simple "C" shape. Start here to get comfortable with curves!
- 3. **Hook Letters**: These letters combine a small curve (or "hook") with a straight line.
- 4. Hill Letters: These letters have rounded "hills" to make their shapes.
- 5. **Diagonal Letters**: These letters have slanted lines that are a bit more challenging.

How to Use This Packet

- 1. Practice Makes Perfect: Trace each letter carefully. Start slow and focus on staying on the lines.
- 2.Go at Your Own Pace: Everyone learns differently. Take your time and move on when you feel ready.
- 3. Check Your Progress: After tracing, try writing the letters on your own using the blank lines provided.

By the time you finish, you'll have the skills and confidence to write all your lowercase letters beautifully. We encourage you to use the packet over and over to get practice with each letter.

Let's get started and have fun on this handwriting journey!







These letters combine a curve and a straight line, building on the Magic C concept and adding a vertical stroke.


